We shared sadness in how other things had not turned out the way we thought that they would in relationships and attitudes. I realized that I was talking about what I do not have in my life.

I have learned that when I am focusing on what I do not have I need to change gears. It is time to change my heart to thankfulness. When I feel disappointment, I stop and look at what is good.

I shared with my old friend how blessings have grown amidst the disappointments. but God's wisdom is **everlasting**.

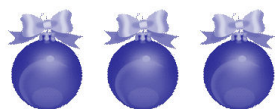
